Two dozen biodiesel representatives are slated to testify at an EPA hearing on the agency's latest proposal establishing volumes under the Renewable Fuel Standard. The industry leaders, coming from states across the country, planned to thank the EPA for increasing volumes in the latest proposal while calling for further growth in the final rule set to be released in November.
